

A broad curriculum to build a solid foundation for our children's future

We cater for all children aged seven to eleven.

For most lessons, they are taught in mixed ability classes. However, there are some occasions when we believe that our pupils benefit from 'setting'. The total amount of time spent on teaching each week is 23.5 hours. The curriculum is broad. English, Mathematics, Science and Computer Technology are our priority subjects, but not at the expense of the many other exciting activities that help to give children a solid foundation for the future.



A good mix of facilities for children's learning, enjoyment and development

We have eight classes (two in each year group), a library, a computer suite, a pottery and craft area and a hall/gynasium. We also have extensive sports fields, where children take part in a wide range of activities including football, netball, cricket, rugby, athletics and hockey.

Opening pupils' eyes to the environment in which they live

Children have the opportunity to go on carefully supervised trips - some local and some further afield to extend their knowledge of the world around them. This is also good for team-building among the children, who learn that life is about working harmoniously and effectively with those around you.



Our Achievement Awards

From the time they arrive in the school to the time they leave, all our pupils take part in our *Achievement Awards*. Trophies are presented to classes and to individuals for their good work, effort, courtesy, respect and tidiness. Every week, each class teacher awards a badge to the child who, in their opinion, has worked hardest and to the child who has achieved the highest standard of conduct.

Their names are then written in what we call our *Book of Champions*.

If a child's name appears five times in the book in Years 3 and 4, they become a *Squire of Middlemarch*. A further ten badges and they become a *Knight of Middlemarch*. Squires and Knights also receive their named brick to place on our Wall of Achievement (see inside this leaflet). The scheme continues in Years 5 and 6.

All certificates and badges awarded are kept in pupils' own 'Record of Achievement'.

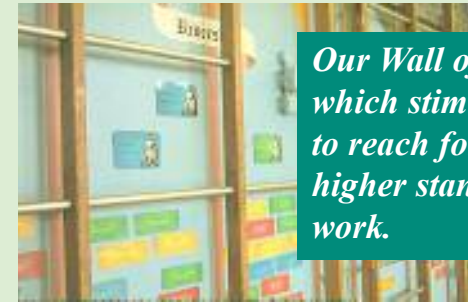
